Slí Abhaile

Michael worked for a multinational company in the IT sector as a manufacturing technician. The company underwent a restructuring process leading to large scale job losses in its Irish facility. Unfortunately, Michael lost his job and was made unemployed for the first time in his life. He found it difficult to get another job as his skillset was specific to the IT sector. With his redundancy and savings used up, Michael could no longer afford to pay his rent and was evicted.

Michael found himself homeless and turned to Depaul Ireland for help and support. They gave him temporary accommodation in a hostel and helped him to secure a place on a training course allowing him to upskill. Thankfully, on completion of the course, he secured a job and managed to get permanent accommodation. He was able to rebuild his life.

Remembering the friendship and support he received from Depaul Ireland, Michael found ways to give back to the charity whenever he could. He helped with fundraising campaigns and volunteered on the soup run one night a week.

As part of a new job, Michael was relocated to Drumbridge, a medium size town, in the south west. Recently, Michael noticed that there were people sleeping rough in the town centre. The impact of the recent surge in homelessness on the local community has been seen economically and socially in the town.

Michael soon realised there wasn't any homeless charity providing supports in the town. He decided to help by starting a soup run and distributing personal care packs to any homeless people he encountered. It was just himself and his wife, Rita, to begin with which meant they could only help a small number of people. Through setting up a social media account showing the work that they are doing, Michael and Rita now have 20 volunteers helping out regularly, which means they can help a greater number of clients. This account has also helped them to secure sponsorship and donations.

As demand for their services grew, Michael decided to set up a charity, Slí Abhaile. He contacted the Charity Regulator who advised him that the trustees of the charity (Michael and Rita) must apply for a Registered Charity number, as it is a legal requirement.

Michael has decided to form a committee, 'The Slí Abhaile Action Group', as he has many plans for the charity. He hopes to expand the range of supports he is currently offering, including a hostel in the medium term and building social housing in the long term. The action group will need a variety of skills and expertise to help develop and execute these plans successfully.
